

### 2018 Progress Report

New Mexico's federal data shows a pattern of oscillation, with considerable variability between individual years.

This inconsistency is most visible in the rate of bicyclist traffic deaths and the state's use of federal funds for bicycling and walking.

For each of these federal data indicators, the ten-year trend has a stronger direction than many other states, but is punctuated by years where the state performs well above or below average.

Hopefully the development of the Statewide Prioritized Bicycle Network Plan will lead to more predictable, and improving, federal data.






## Featured Agency - New Mexico Department of Transportation

"In the summer of 2017 NMDOT began developing the Statewide Prioritized Bicycle Network Plan (NM Bike Plan). The Plan is expected to be released in fall of 2018.

During the plan development process NMDOT held public meetings across the state, presented at MPO/RTPO meetings, and developed an interactive online map and survey to reach stakeholders statewide. NMDOT received 593 survey responses and 2,330 interactions with the online map.

The plan works within NMDOT's roadway rehabilitation and reconstruction processes to ensure bicycle facilities are included on the roadways identified within the plan."

"The NM Bike Plan includes design guidelines for bicycle infrastructure and are based on current best practices. Part of the NM Bike Plan implementation is outreach and training to NMDOT engineers and staff."
