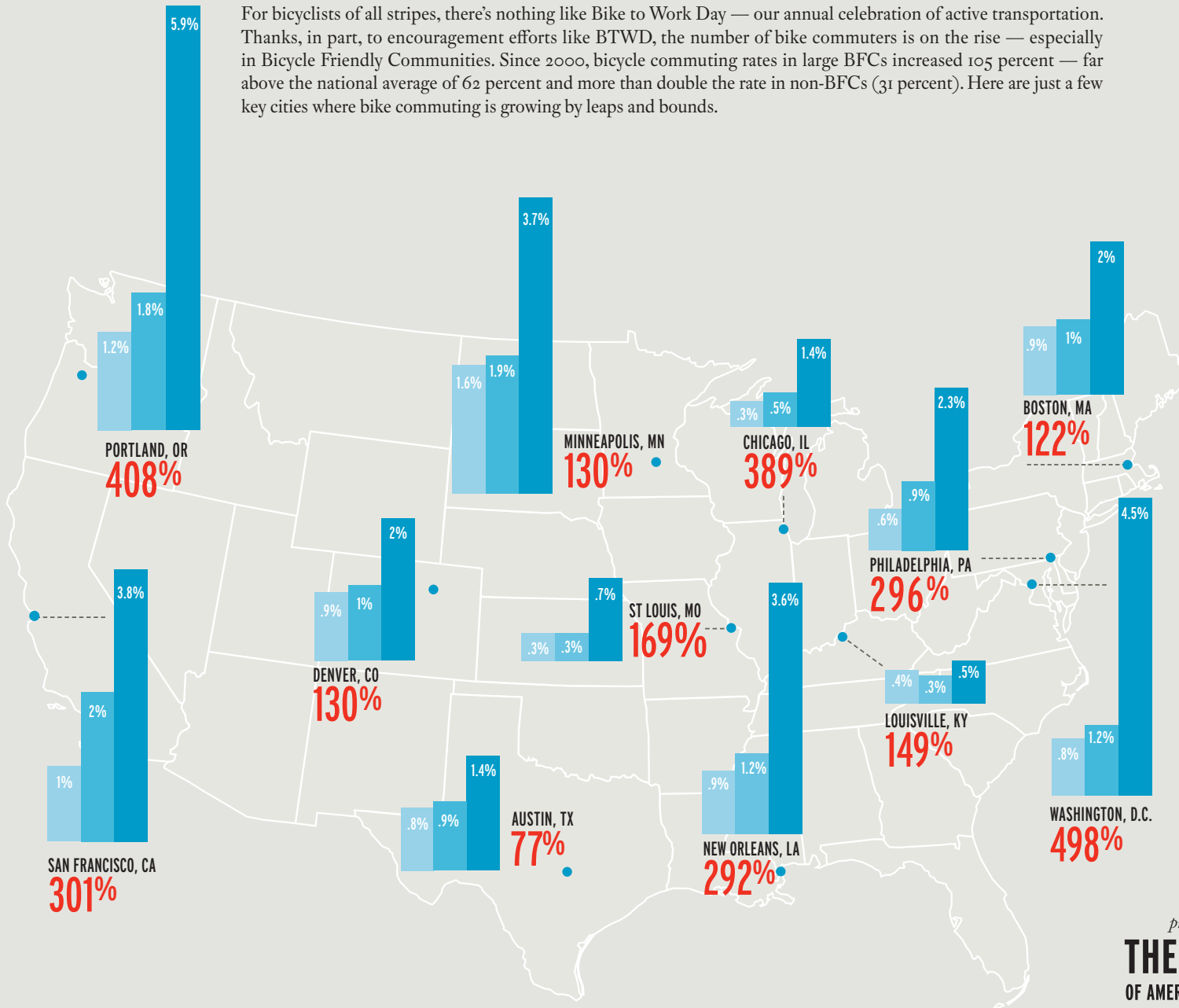


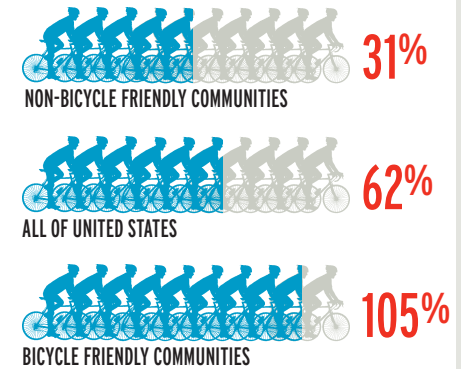
THE GROWTH OF BIKE COMMUTING

For bicyclists of all stripes, there's nothing like Bike to Work Day — our annual celebration of active transportation. Thanks, in part, to encouragement efforts like BTWD, the number of bike commuters is on the rise — especially in Bicycle Friendly Communities. Since 2000, bicycle commuting rates in large BFCs increased 105 percent — far above the national average of 62 percent and more than double the rate in non-BFCs (31 percent). Here are just a few key cities where bike commuting is growing by leaps and bounds.
