Making the Case

- Facebook is No. 1
 - Almost 75% of businesses/organizations use it
 - Nearly one in six people in the world are active users.
 - On any given day, there are 665 million active users
 - Facebook drives more action than Twitter, but less than email



Rules of Thumb

- Update your page at least once a day, but not more than three or four times
- Starting a conversation will keep users engaged and coming back to your page
- Pictures, pictures!



Part Three: Building Community

- Maintain benchmarks and metrics
 - Note how many shares your posts receive
 - Check your "insights" page
 - Mark what types of topics/discussions spark the most engagement from your audience



What to Post

- Blogs
- Campaigns
- Local news
- Relevant updates from partners/organizations in the movement - make your page a hub of information

10 MYTHS ABOUT WOMEN AND BICYCLING

WOMEN DON'T LIKE BIKES	82% of American women have a positive view of bicyclists.®
WOMEN AREN'T CONCERNED ABOUT BIKING IN THEIR COMMUNITIES	2/3 of American women agree: "My community would be a better place to live if biking were safer and more comfortable." (9)
WOMEN ARE A JUST A SMALL NICHE MARKET	From 2003 to 2012, the number of women and girls participating in bicycling rose 20%, while dropping 0.5% among men and boys. 60% of bicycle owners aged 17 to 28 years old are women.
WOMEN AREN'T INTERESTED In riding	47% of potential cyclists in Portland. Ore., who are "Interested but Concerned" about riding a bike are women. ⁽¹⁾
WOMEN ACCOUNT FOR VERY FEW BIKE TRIPS IN THE U.S.	Women took more than 982 million bicycle trips in 2009. ©
WOMEN DON'T BIKE TO WORK In Significant numbers	1.9 million women regularly commuted to work by bike in 2011. The overall number of women who bike commute grew 56% from 2007 to 2011. (5)
