KEY STEPS TO SILVER

Continue to expand the bike network and increase connectivity
Consider having City

through the use of different types of bicycle facilities appropriate for the speed and volume of motor vehicle traffic on each road.

>> Ensure that your Complete Streets policy is followed for all projects, and that compliance is tracked. If necessary, revisit your Complete Streets policy and process to ensure better compliance.

» Adopt a bike parking ordinance for new and existing buildings that specifies standards for the amount and location of secure, convenient, APBP-compliant bike parking available.

» Consider launching a bike share system that is open to the public.

» Host a League Cycling Instructor (LCI) seminar to increase the number of local LCIs in your community.

» Encourage more local businesses, agencies, and organizations to promote cycling to their employees and customers and to seek recognition through the Bicycle Friendly Business (BFB) program.

Consider having City Hall apply to the BFB program as an employer to lead by example among other Portsmouth employers.

» Continue efforts to improve data-driven road safety operations and Vision Zero activities. Work with neighboring jurisdictions to develop a coordinated and comprehensive Vision Zero program.

» Create an official Bicycle & Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) to create a systematic method for ongoing citizen input into the development of important policies, plans, and projects.

» Begin the process of creating a new Bicycle Master Plan or updating the 2010 Master Transportation Plan. Regularly updating your bicycle plan is key to improving conditions for bicycling, adhering to evolving best practices and national standards, and institutionalizing processes for continual evaluation and improvement.

Adopt a target level of bicycle use (percent of trips) to be achieved within a specific timeframe, and ensure data collection necessary to monitor progress.
