





About Bike Emory

1. What is the Bike Emory initiative?

Bike Emory is a new program developed in collaboration with our two bicycling partners, Fuji Bikes and Bicycle South. Bike Emory is dedicated to promoting biking as a fun, safe, and economical transportation alternative. We want to encourage bicycling and bike safety by sponsoring bike-related events, and sharing useful information with bicyclists around Emory. Biking is a fun activity that's not only good for your health, it's also better for the environment, and reduces traffic in our community.

2. Why not bike?

That's the question we're asking all around Emory. We want to make bicycling as convenient as possible—whether you're riding to work, class, or just for fun. Visit the website at bike. emory.edu to stay connected to the biking community, receive updates and tips, and Bike Emory promotional deals.

3. Did you say promotional deals?

Yes. Through collaboration with our bicycling partners, Bike Emory is able to offer reduced prices on select models of Fuji bikes. These premium bikes are being discounted up to \$100 off the regular price. Purchase your bike from the website and you will receive a free helmet, an anti-theft "u-lock," and a rear safety light (while supplies last). We'll even register your new bike for free through the Emory Police Department. These are just a few of the discounts offered to faculty, staff, and students who sign up for the Bike Emory email list.

4. What if a bicyclist would like to ride around campus at Emory, but it is not feasible for them to commute to Emory by bike?

Beginning this fall, Bike Emory will offer a free "loaner" program to help you get around campus and not worry about driving (or parking). Simply show your Emory ID to check out a bike from one of the loaner locations, grab a helmet, and you're ready to go.

5. Where are the "bike loaner" locations?


You can check out "loaner" bikes at the Peavine parking deck and at the 1762 building on Clifton Road. Future loaner locations will be announced throughout the fall. Visit bike.emory.edu for updates.

6. What if my bike breaks on campus?

Even the best bikes need repairing. You can take your set of wheels over to Bicycle South and they'll have you back on the road in no time. Starting this summer, Bicycle South will offer an on-campus Mobile Repair Center twice a week (Wednesdays and Fridays) at two locations—in front of the DUC and in front of the SAAC on the Clairmont Campus. Minor repairs will be made on-site, but for other repairs, Bicycle South will take your bike and return it repaired at their next visit (usually in just a few days). You can also pick it up at their shop location at North Decatur and Clairmont roads.

Bike Emory wants you to ride your bike safely and maintain it properly.

Starting this fall we will offer effective bicycling classes at Emory, with assistance from the Atlanta Bicycle Campaign, on the following dates:

- September 22, from 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m., at White Hall. For more details and to sign up, visit bike.emory.edu.
- October 13, from 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m., at the North Decatur Building (police training room). For more details and to sign up, contact Patricia McCants at pmccant@emory.edu.

Cost: \$20 (bring your own helmet and bicycle)

This class covers tips on basic bicycle maintenance, how to gain control of your bike when making sudden stops, and more. Sessions also include information on bicycling for commuting; selecting equipment; nighttime riding; seasonal and inclement weather riding; finding a commute route; connections to transit; and bicycle parking and security. Students completing this class have the option to attend a second session for certification (at another location) at no extra charge.


