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League Cycling Instructor Seminars

Terms to Know

League Cycling Instructors (LCIs): dedicated individuals who have completed a detailed training program and are insured and certified to teach the League's Smart Cycling curriculum

LCI Seminar: 23-hour training course focused on teaching and demonstrating techniques to be used with future students both on the road and in the classroom

- emphasis on how to teach bicycle safety and skills so as to provide increased comfort and confidence for new and returning bicyclists and youth
- does not emphasize the content or specific details of the cycling course curricula
- primarily about teaching
- each candidate will have opportunities during the seminar to practice facilitating parts of the Smart Cycling curriculum, both in the classroom and in the parking lot
- normally consists of one evening and two full days
- generally, one-third of the time is on-bike





Site Facilitator: individual local to the community in which an LCI seminar is being held who is willing to make the seminar happen - coordinates with potential applicants, sets a date, arranges a site, acts as point of contact during the seminar, etc.

League Cycling Coach: expert instructor of bicycle safety education who leads LCI Seminars and certifies new LCIs; approved and hired as independent contractors of the League of American Bicyclists








LCIs have access to entire Smart Cycling Curriculum and are empowered to tailor components to suit their audiences.

LCI Seminars

Getting Started

- Download the FAQs of hosting an LCI Seminar
- <u>Download and review the Memorandum of Understanding</u> (MOU) to understand the roles and responsibilities of the Site Facilitator of an LCI Seminar
- Email a signed copy of Attachment A of the MOU to education@bikeleague.org
- Schedule and attend a virtual meeting to discuss the seminar process with a League staff member
 - a link to schedule a meeting with us will be provided to you after you have emailed us to express your interest





90 Days (or more) Before Your Seminar

- Designate a Site Facilitator
 - organizes logistics, promotes the Seminar, and collaborates with the Coach
 - should be a self-starter, passionate about biking, who has a desire to spread education throughout their community
- Secure a suitable facility for the seminar
 - includes both Classroom and Parking Lot space
- Turn in MOU to the League
 - sent to <u>education@bikeleague.org</u>
- Start recruiting qualified students







Classroom

- able to seat at least 16 people
- ideally a minimum of 30 ft x 22 ft
- audio visual technology must be available in the room
- wifi is recommended but not required
- should be clean, have access to a bathroom, and be well ventilated
- recommended for classroom to be ADA accessible

LCI Seminar

Facility Needs







Parking Lot

- will be used to practice setting up and teaching bike handling drills and avoidance maneuvers
- big enough for multiple drill areas
 150 ft x 80 ft
 - smooth continuous surface with no
- potholes and clean of debris
- should be no other use during the seminar
- access to low volume, low speed roads for the start of the road ride
- access to a nearby bathroom and sheltered space is highly encouraged

LCI Seminar

Facility Needs



Site Facilitator should check with property owner(s) to discuss liability issues of both spaces and have proof of insurance coverage issued by the League's insurance agent if required.







Required MOU Details

- Email completed and signed copy of Attachment A of the MOU to education@bikeleague.org
- Should be submitted at least 90 days prior to your requested date
- MOU must contain the location of the seminar site and contact info for the Site Facilitator
- You will indicate whether or not you want your seminar to be open to the public
 - A seminar that is Open will be posted on the <u>LCI Seminar Schedule</u> and <u>Local Resources map</u> on the League's website
 - A seminar that is Closed will not be listed on the League's website, meaning only the selected candidates you share the registration link with will be able to sign up



































Optional MOU Details

- requests are taken into consideration, however, dates and Ο location are factors in which Coach the League assigns
- If your organization is paying for candidates' LCI seminar registration fees and/or memberships to the League of American Bicyclists, you should also complete Attachment


















Registration and Membership Costs



- Early Bird Registration Rate: \$500
 - Available until *four weeks* prior to the start of the seminar
- Standard Registration: \$575
- Registration closes *three weeks* prior to the start of the seminar.

We need a minimum of 8 paid candidates signed up for the seminar for it to move forward on the scheduled dates. League Membership:

- 1 Year of Individual Membership: \$50
- All LCI candidates must have an individual or family membership to the League.
 - This is for insurance purposes
 - We cannot accept organizational or business membership for LCI candidates
 - Membership must be kept current in order to work as an LCI





Recruiting and Supporting Participants

You can help alleviate barriers for your participants and increase registration numbers by doing any of the following:

- If you would like to provide payment for some or all of your candidates registration fees and/or League Memberships, please submit Attachment D of the MOU to <u>education@bikeleague.org</u>
 - You will be sent a discount code via email to pass onto your selected candidates
 - Paying organization will be invoiced for the number of code redemptions made within 30 days of the seminar
 - candidates should register themselves using the codes for registration and membership

- Work with an active LCI in your area to host Smart Cycling classes in the months leading up to your seminar
 - find active LCI's in your area by searching your zip code, city, or state at <u>bikeleague.org/map</u>
- You may develop homestay accommodations for out-of-town candidates and/or the Coach
- You may wish to provide light refreshments during the seminar
 - The League will reimburse a host organization up to \$100 for snacks and beverages you opt to provide candidates during the seminar



All registrations made using your specific discount code are still subject to the League's registration fees and Cancellation Policy.







Scholarships

The host organization receives:

- One scholarshipped registration when registration meets 8 candidates.
- Two scholarshipped registrations if the seminar reaches 15 candidates.
- Encouraged that host organization offers to help meet your local bicycling needs
- Not meant to create more difficulty for the host organization,
 - option to decline the scholarship(s) if administering it is a hardship
- The League cannot "break up" the scholarship, it must be used for one full registration.
- A sample scholarship application is available as a <u>Google Form</u> as well as in Attachment C of the MOU.
- After paid registrations for the seminar have met the required threshold, the League will provide a discount code to the Site Facilitator to award the scholarship.
- Candidate(s) are expected to register for the seminar using the code prior to registration closing.








Getting the Word Out

- After a Site Facilitator has submitted a completed MOU and attended a short meeting with League staff, the League will confirm a Coach for your seminar and send you the registration information via email.
- Review this information to ensure everything appears as you intended.
 - If you marked your seminar as Open to the public, the League will add your event to the <u>LCI Seminar Schedule</u> approximately 24 hours after emailing you the registration information.
- A link to a sample <u>communications toolkit</u> and <u>scholarship application</u> will also be provided in this email.
- Recruiting enough participants for your seminar to meet the 8-candidate minimum is one of the most important things you can do to ensure the success of your LCI Seminar









Site Facilitator & Coach Shared Responsibilities

- Help identify local LCI assistants
 - The League provides a stipend to the Coach to pay LCI assistant(s)
 - It is at the Coach's discretion how to break up the stipend for LCI Assistants

8 - 9	\$150		
10 -12	\$300		
13 - 15	\$600		
16 - 18	\$900		

- Help identify a 6-7 mile road ride for the seminar route
 - meets the needs of Coach's time allotment and road test criteria









Meeting the Registration Minimum

- Registration closes 3 weeks before the scheduled date of the seminar.
- At this time, League staff will approve, postpone, or cancel the seminar based on the meeting of all requirements, particularly the 8-candidate minimum
- If the seminar is postponed or canceled, paid candidates may attend any subsequent seminar for no additional charge or may help the Site Facilitator reschedule the seminar for that location.
- If the seminar meets all requirements, Site Facilitator will be expected to provide a shipping address and receive seminar materials through the mail.

We need a minimum of 8 paid candidates signed up for the seminar for it to move forward on the scheduled dates.







Site Facilitator Duties During the Seminar

- Maintain a roster of seminar candidates with emergency contact information
- Attend seminar and assist Coach with logistics
 - i.e. opening/closing space, set up AV, etc.
- Take group photo at the end of the seminar
 - Additional photos taken throughout the seminar are beneficial
 - can be used for your promotion of future LCI seminars
- Assist Coach with candidate meetings at the end of the seminar
