KEY STEPS TO SILVER



- » Congratulations on adopting the 2017 Pedestrian and Bicycle Connection Master Plan. This plan will be a blueprint for improvements and has many great recommendations for a more connected network of safe and comfortable bicycle facilities.
- » Focus on expanding the bike network, both through on- and offroad bikeway facilities that meet or exceed current NACTO standards. Ensure that your community follows a selection criteria that increases separation and protection of bicyclists based on levels of motor vehicle speed and volume.
- » Ensure that your Complete Streets policy is followed for all projects, and that compliance is tracked.
- » Adopt a bike parking ordinance for new and existing buildings that specifies the amount and location of secure, convenient, APBP-compliant bike parking available. Continue to increase the amount of high quality bicycle parking throughout the community.
- >> Consider launching a bike share system that is open to the public.

- » Expand bicycle education opportunities for adults. Consider ways to target demographics who currently do not feel safe riding with classes or events that address their concerns.
- » Encourage more local businesses, agencies, and organizations to promote cycling to their employees and customers and to seek recognition through the Bicycle Friendly Business program.
- » Provide education to law enforcement officers on bicycle safety and traffic laws as they apply to bicyclists and motorists and bicycling skills.
- » Adopt a comprehensive road safety plan or a Vision Zero policy to create engineering, education, and enforcement strategies to reduce traffic crashes and deaths for all road users.
- >> Encourage your Bicycle Advisory Committee to meet more often.
- Adopt a target level of bicycle use (percent of trips) to be achieved within a specific timeframe, and ensure data collection necessary to monitor progress.
