KEY STEPS TO SILVER



- Congratulations on adopting a Complete Streets policy. It is important to ensure that there is a strong implementation and compliance process for this new policy going forward.
- Continue to increase the amount of high quality bicycle parking throughout the community.
- » Consider launching a bike share system that is open to the public.
- » Work with local bicycle groups and interested parents to expand and improve the Safe Routes to School program to all schools. In particular, middle and high school education efforts could be improved.
- Expand bicycle education opportunities for adults. Host a League Cycling Instructor (LCI) seminar to increase the number of local LCIs in your community.
- Develop a community-wide trip reduction ordinance/program, incentive program, and/or a Guaranteed Ride Home program to

encourage and support bike commuters in Santa Clara.

- » Encourage more local businesses, agencies, and organizations to promote cycling to their employees and customers and to seek recognition through the League's Bicycle Friendly Business program.
- » Adopt a comprehensive road safety plan or a Vision Zero policy to create engineering, education, and enforcement strategies to reduce traffic crashes and deaths for all road users.
- » Begin the process of creating a new Bicycle Master Plan or updating your 2009 bike plan. Regularly updating your bicycle plan is key to improving conditions for bicycling, adhering to evolving best practices and national standards, and institutionalizing processes for continual evaluation and improvement.
- Adopt a target level of bicycle use (percent of trips) to be achieved within a specific timeframe, and ensure data collection necessary to monitor progress.
