KEY STEPS TO PLATINUM



- Ensure that your community follows a bicycle facility selection criteria that increases separation and protection of bicyclists based on levels of motor vehicle speed and volume.
- » Consider launching a bike share system that is open to the public. Bike sharing is a convenient, cost effective, and healthy way of encouraging locals and visitors to make short trips by bike, make bicycling more accessible to all, and to bridge the 'last mile' between public transit and destinations.
- Expand bicycle safety education to be a routine part of education for students of all ages, and ensure that schools and the surrounding neighborhoods are particularly

- safe and convenient for biking and walking. Work with local bicycle groups and interested parents to create Safe Routes to School programming for all K-12 schools.
- Work with local League Cycling Instructors (LCIs) to offer Bicycle Friendly Driver training to motorists in Chico, particularly to professional drivers and fleet operators.
- » Appoint a staff member Bicycle & Pedestrian Coordinator or create a new position.
- » Continue efforts to improve data-driven road safety operations and Vision Zero activities. Develop a coordinated and comprehensive Vision Zero plan and program.
