- >> Hire a full-time bicycle/mobility coordinator who will be committed to improving bicycling in the community.
- >> Continue efforts to work with Caltrans to reallocate road space on state-controlled roads and address areas where statecontrolled roads are barriers to the mobility of people who bike and walk.
- >> Provide a variety of targeted bicycle events to engage women, seniors, families, and other demographic groups that may benefit from non-traditional or group-specific bicycle events. Targeted events may help to encourage groups that have specific concerns about bicycling or which have not previously been engaged in supporting bicycling improvements.
- >> Leverage current Bike to Work Day efforts to increase engagement with area businesses, including by encouraging them to become Bicycle Friendly Businesses, and create events and education that encourage bicycling throughout the year.
- Increase the amount of high quality bicycle parking throughout the community. As the use of bicycles grows it is important that people arriving by bicycle have a secure and legal place to lock their bikes at popular destinations.
- >> Ensure that your bicycle plan is fully funded and implemented in a timely manner.
- Increase opportunities for police training on bicycling-related issues.
