KEY STEPS TO GOLD



- Continue to expand your bicycle network in order to create a cohesive, connected on-street bike network and ensure that your community follows a bicycle facility selection criteria that increases separation and protection of bicyclists based on levels of motor vehicle speed and volume.
- Conduct a bike parking study or audit to determine current conditions of bike parking, both in terms of quality and quantity.
- Consider launching a bike share system that is open to the public. Bike sharing is a convenient, cost effective, and healthy way to encourage locals and visitors to make short trips by bike.
- Continue to expand bicycle safety education to be a routine part of education for students of all ages, and ensure that schools and the surrounding neighborhoods are particularly safe

and convenient for biking and walking.

- Congratulations on adopting an Active Transportation Plan. This plan will be a blueprint for improvements and has many great recommendations for a more connected network of safe and comfortable bicycle facilities. Build momentum off its adoption and implement the recommendations of the plan.
- Continue efforts to improve data-driven road safety operations and Vision Zero activities. Develop a coordinated and comprehensive Vision Zero plan and program.
