#### **FEEDBACK**

Use the new authority the Delaware General Assembly gave to DelDOT in 2024 to fix stroads.

Spend at least 2% of federal transportation funds on biking and walking improvements. Expanding funding for the state's "Bike and Pedestrian Improvements" DeIDOT budget line item to at least \$10 million per year and for the Delaware Bicycle Council's Bikeway Innovation Grant program would provide Delaware more than enough resources to take this key Bicycle Friendly Action.

Work with a municipality to establish Delaware's first official "Complete Community."

Delaware sets default urban area speed limits above 20 miles per hour and does not provide clear legal authority or guidance for how communities may establish 20 mile per hour speed limits on streets in urban or residential areas. We know that slow road save lives and clearer laws and guidance supporting slower streets will benefit the safety of all people using Delaware's streets.

Use updated state design guidance on roundabouts to create new multimodal roundabout designs in urban and suburban areas.

### ONE SUCCESS

Delaware has strong recent data showing that its past investments in bicycling infrastructure are paying off, with a top three growth rate in bicycling according to StreetLight Data and Census Bureau estimates.

**TOP TIP** 

Roundabouts are proven to improve intersection safety, but can be difficult for people biking. Commit to being a leader on roundabout safety and build hundreds of multimodal roundabouts in the next 10 years.
