FEEDBACK

Adopt a safe passing law with a minimum distance of 3 feet to address bicyclist safety. Iowa is one of only 10 states that does not define a safe distance.

Congratulations on spending at least 2% of federal transportation funds on biking and walking improvements. The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law has provided increased federal funding for transportation and it is great to see it resulting in greater investments in bicycling and walking improvements.

Adopt a law prohibiting a motorist from opening an automobile's door unless the motorist is able to do so safely. Iowa is one of only eight states that has not adopted this type of law to reduce "dooring."

lowa's successful use of federal funds is thanks to many state and local-level funding initiatives such as the Rebuild lowa Infrastructure Fund and Destination lowa funding for economic development. Build on these successes by continuing to support funding for bicycling improvements.

Adopt a primary enforcement law allowing an officer to cite a driver for handheld use of a cellphone to reduce dangerous distracted driving.

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Iowa passed the Crosswalk Protections Bill which proactively protects cyclists in crosswalks, marked or unmarked, and in any type of roadway statewide. Research from Iowa State University helped show the need for this legal reform and other states should follow this example.

TOP TIP

Most states prohibit handheld cellphone use while driving, but lowa does not. Adopting a primary enforcement law allowing an officer to cite a driver for handheld use of a cellphone would reduce dangerous distracted driving.
