## **FEEDBACK**

It is exciting to see the Maryland Department of Transportation partner with Smart Growth America to work on quick-build pedestrian and bicycle projects. Quick build projects are low-cost and adaptable, and can yield improvements for bicyclists and help agencies work through new designs, ideas, and processes for improving bicycling and walking.

Repeal the state's mandatory bike lane law. These types of laws ignore the quality and safety of available bike lanes.

The Maryland Department of Transportation published a new Complete Streets Policy and launched its Model Complete Streets Initiative which will include a sidewalk data collaboration to inventory sidewalks throughout the state. This is an incredible effort that many cities can struggle with and we hope the data and lessons learned inspire other states to take this effort on.

ONE SUCCESS The Maryland Department of Transportation partnered with Smart Growth America to work on quick-build pedestrian and bicycle projects and regularly hosts webinars promoting improvements to bicycling and walking.

**TOP TIP** 

Maryland currently uses Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside funding to fund Safe Routes to School. It would be great to see school-based on-bike education expanded with more diverse funding sources.
