FEEDBACK

Mississippi remains one of only five states that has never adopted a statewide bike plan. Mississippi is consistently the most dangerous state based on fatalities per bike commuters and among the most dangerous states based on fatalities per capita, and has similarly dangerous statistics for pedestrian safety. Since 2015, when the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration began reporting traffic deaths based on the agency that owns the roadway, a majority of bicyclists killed in Mississippi were killed on roads owned by the Mississippi DOT.

Spend at least 2% of federal transportation funds on biking and walking improvements.

MIssissippi has one of the lowest rates of bicycling to work in the nation. Bicycling is cheap, safe, and doesn't pollute. Work with cities to provide networks that allow more people to safely bike to work.

ONE SUCCESS

Twelve communities throughout Mississippi have received Safe Streets and Roads for All grants to create comprehensive safety action plans with a goal of significantly decreasing traffic deaths.

TOP TIP

Mississippi is one of only five states that has never adopted a statewide bike plan. Adopting a statewide bike plan can guide investments and improvements.
