FEEDBACK

The most recent statewide bike plan for Virginia was created in 2011. While the state has indicated that an update is in process, no public materials were provided. The League of American Bicyclists hopes that the Virginia DOT is updating its statewide bike plan and that public engagement appears soon.

Congratulations on spending at least 2% of federal transportation funds on biking and walking improvements. The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law has provided increased federal funding for transportation and it is great to see it resulting in greater investments in bicycling and walking improvements.

Legislative changes in 2021 and 2024 have improved the ability of communities in Virginia to implement slower speed limits that save lives. Most recently, §46.2-1300 was amended to allow speed limits below 25 mph in business and residence districts, even on state-owned roads. We're excited to see communities use this new authority.

Virginia's Complete Streets policy was adopted in 2004. Some of the accommodations allowed under this policy include 2-foot shoulders that are not accepted as best practice today. Ensuring this policy supports VDOT's work on innovative treatments would be an improvement.

A statewide active transportation conference would be a great way to build on the work of localities, VDOT, trail expansions, and the Virginia Walkability Action Institute.

Virginia achieved our key Bicycle Friendly Action of spending at least two percent of federal transportation funds on bicycling and walking projects each of the last three years. Keep it up!

TOP TIP

Virginia's SmartScale process has received national recognition for its transparent scoring of priority projects, but recent changes eliminated land use as a criteria and made several other changes that make funding bicycle and pedestrian safety projects more difficult. Evaluate the impact of those changes and update the program.
